Billy Ocean, the biggest Black recording star Britain has ever produced, has sold more than 30 million records and topped the pop charts around the globe. Born in Trinidad and raised in London, he rose to fame in the 1970s and 1980s with global hits including “Love Really Hurts Without You,” “Caribbean Queen” (which earned him a Grammy), “Suddenly,” “There’ll Be Sad Songs,” and “Get Outta My Dreams, Get Into My Car.”

Tab Benoit and Samantha Fish, two Grammy nominated singers, songwriters, and guitarists, bring their distinctive and powerful brands of Americana roots and blues to the MSU Riley Center. Benoit has built a remarkable career of nearly 40 years on a foundation of gritty, soulful Delta swamp blues. Fish spices her blues-based sound with rock influences, which is why being the opening act for the final U.S. date of the Rolling Stones tour in 2024 was a “bucket list” thrill for her. On this co-headlining tour, each artist plays a separate set. Then Benoit and Fish share the stage for an encore that explodes with guitar fireworks.

Graham Russell and Russell Hitchcock have spent half a century honing their skills, harnessing their passion, and unleashing the beautifully intimate yet rockin' romantic energy of the instantly identifiable '80s hits that made them global superstars. After meeting in the Australian touring company of "Jesus Christ Superstar," they formed Air Supply in May 1975. Five consecutive singles reached the Billboard Top 5 in 1980-81 ("Lost in Love," "All Out of Love," "Every Woman in the World," "The One That You Love," "Here I Am"), followed by such other memorable hits as "Even the Nights Are Better" and "Making Love Out of Nothing at All." Audiences still love them; they perform more than 100 concerts every year.

For nearly four decades, Alison Krauss & Union Station have upheld their legacy as one of the most influential and widely celebrated acts in bluegrass and roots music. The group's highly anticipated 2025 album, "Arcadia," was their first since the 2011 masterpiece "Paper Airplane" and their third straight to top the Billboard Bluegrass Album chart. Together, Krauss & Union Station – Jerry Douglas, Ron Block, Barry Bales, and Russell Moore – have won 14 Grammy Awards. They now continue to celebrate their new music with the Arcadia 2026 Tour.
